



Operation Round Up® boosting local groups

Thanks to the Operation Round Up program, powered by voluntary donations from Central Electric members, over \$38,000 is being put back into the local communities to provide assistance for worthy projects. Grants were awarded to the following nonprofit organizations:

Chatham Co. Council on Aging – \$3,000 for mobile workstation, large wall mirrors and storage units for weights, ball disc and exercise mats.

Chatham Housing Initiatives – \$3,000 to cover costs for workshops for the Energy Savings Crockpot Challenge Program.

Chatham Outreach Alliance – \$3,000 to help support the SNACK Program.

Chatham Trades, Inc. – \$3,000 to support the Adult Developmental Vocational Program (ADVP).

Christian United Outreach – \$3,000 to help purchase food for the pantry.

Ingram Family YMCA – \$3,000 for the 2022 Summer Day Camp to operate at a subsidized rate and provide scholarship assistance.

Johnsonville Elementary School – \$2,996 for a fourth grade field trip to N.C. Museum of Natural Science in Whiteville.

Johnsonville Elementary School (Kindergarten Teacher) – \$1,250.93 to purchase an ABC multicolored area rug.

Johnsonville Elementary School (Library) – \$3,000 to purchase tables and chairs for library.

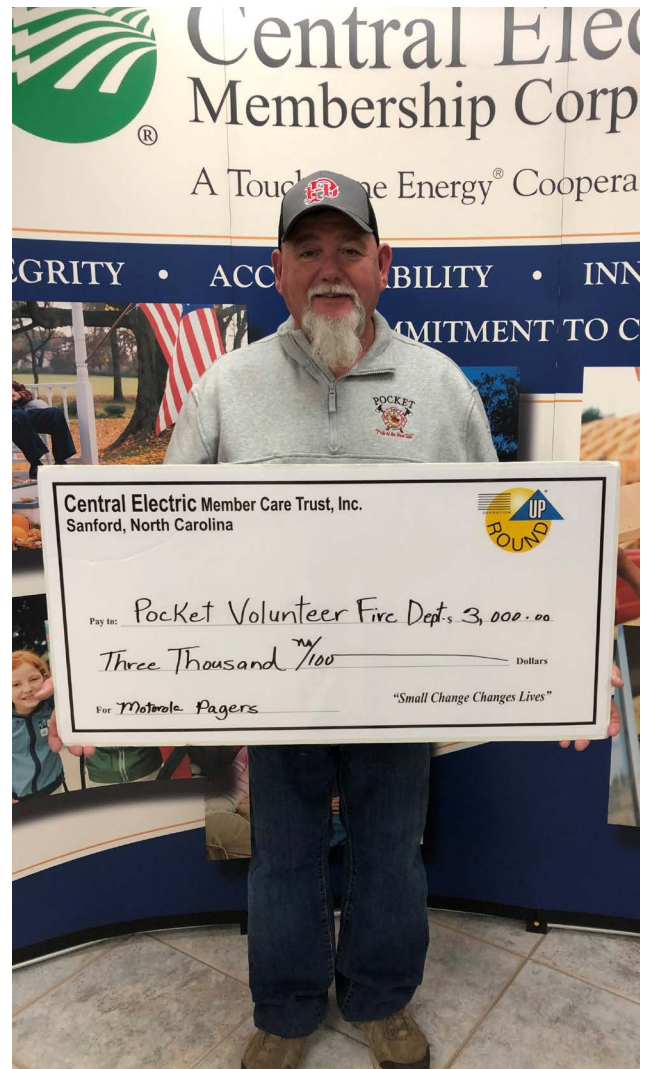
Johnsonville Elementary School (SCMC) – \$1,632.65 to purchase manipulatives for special education classes.
